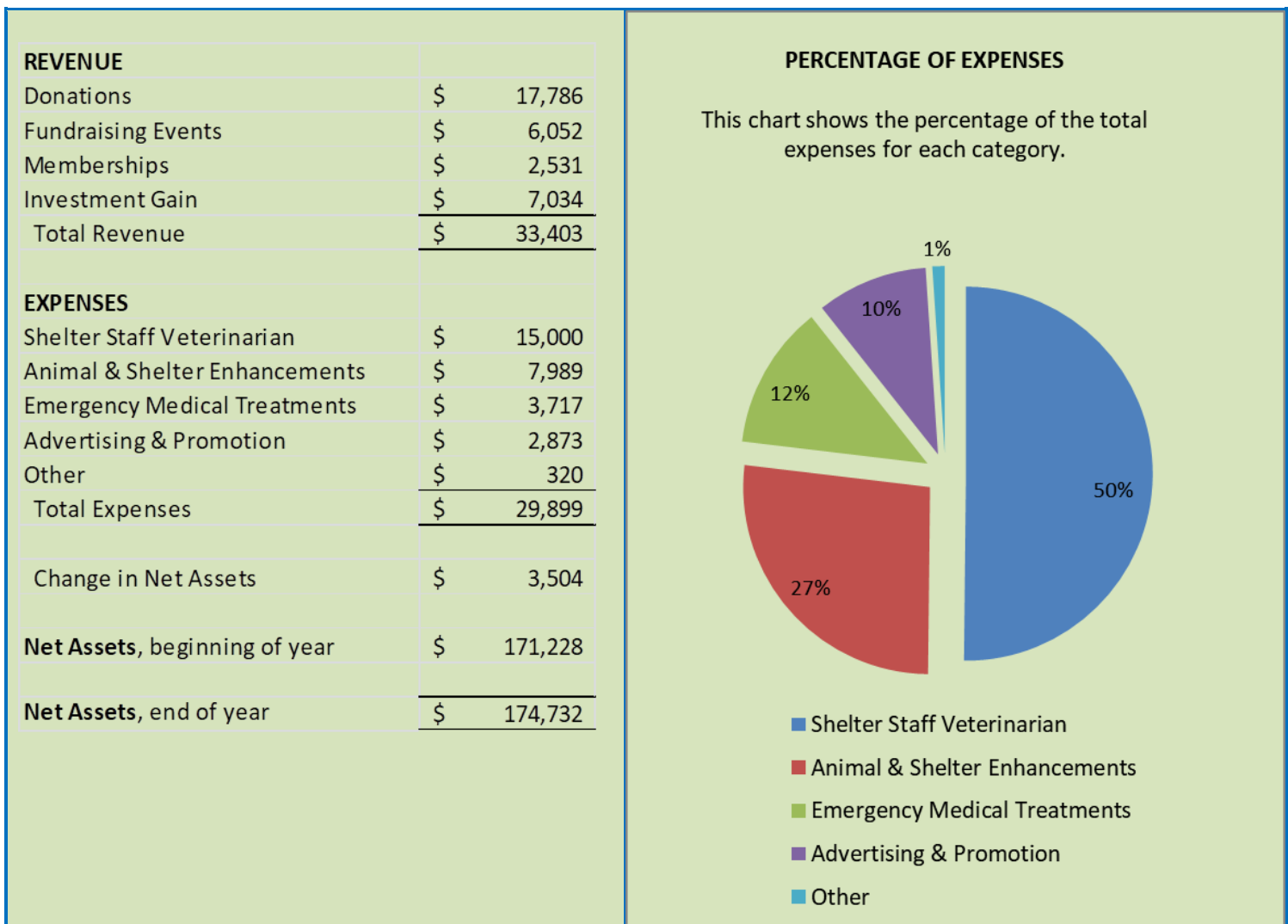

Mr. Sweet Pea

Shortly after Mr. Sweet Pea was surrendered to the shelter, the staff noticed he was holding his tongue out of his mouth and seemed to experience pain when eating. A local veterinarian confirmed he suffered from stomatitis and recommended extractions with antibiotics and steroids to make him feel better.

After a successful surgery he was back to eating and visibly much happier almost instantaneously. Mr. Sweet Pea is only 3 years old and has an entire life to live. He is a sweet boy, who despite his condition, still wants chin scratches and loving!

Belle

Belle is an 8 year old Dachshund who was surrendered by her owner because he was moving. Belle had not had medical care for years before coming to the shelter.

The shelter team noticed she had a large growth between her back legs. A veterinarian confirmed Belle had a hernia that, due to its location, would require specialized surgery to place a surgical mesh internally over the defect.

After recovering from her surgery while under foster care, Belle was adopted by her FURever family.
